

CHILD-FRIENDLY EXPLANATIONS

A good rule of thumb when crafting a student friendly explanation is to include the words *something*, *someone*, or *describes* in your explanation. For example,

- Attention....If someone is getting attention they are being taken care of.
- Discard...If you discard something you get rid of it because you no longer want or need it.
- Skimpy...Skimpy describes something that is too small in size or amount.

<u>COBUILD</u> Dictionary can help with these explanations!
